#### Did you know?

Grizzly bears and polar bears sometimes mate. Inuit people call their hybrid babies "nanulak" or "akunk," combinations of the words for polar bear (nanuk) and grizzly bear (aklak).

### Did you know?

In some local traditions where this quilt was made, cows are considered a treasured form of wealth.

#### Did you know?

Elephants are sacred in Hindu culture, because they are connected to the elephantheaded Hindu deity, Ganesha. Ganesha is held to be a great patron of learning, and he is a remover of obstacles, able to overcome anything to achieve his goals.

# Did you know?

The tradition of asafo warrior groups among the Fante people dates back to at least the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Each Fante town has a group of two to seven warriors who inherit their positions from their fathers.

## Did you know?

Birds are important symbols in many examples of art where this quilt was made. In this country's culture, mandarin ducks symbolize a happy marriage, cranes symbolize long life and wisdom, and magpies symbolize joy.

#### Did you know?

The scientific name for walrus, Odobenus rosmarus, is Latin for "tooth-walking sea horse." Walruses use their tusks to dig into snow, ice, and sand to help drag themselves out of the water.

# Did you know?

People in the Andes Mountains raise both llamas and alpacas. The main way to tell llamas and alpacas apart are that a llama's heads and ears are longer. Llama ears are said to be shaped like bananas.

## Did you know?

The Royal Bengal tiger is the national animal of this country, chosen for its combination of grace, agility, strength and power. Tigers are the largest cats in the world. Large tigers can weigh up to 670lbs!

## Did you know?

Dragons have been part of art in East Asian cultures for more than 4,000 years. In the country this quilt was made in, dragons are symbols of power and good luck. These dragons have the horns of a deer, the neck of a snake, the scales of a carp, the claws of an eagle and the footpads of a tiger.
